





Trainings and Micro-Business Support



Empowering individuals with diverse skills is key to building resilient communities. This initiative provided targeted training programs, equipping participants with practical knowledge to improve their livelihoods and support their families:

- Sewing and Embroidery Training: 45 female trainees.
- Livestock Farming Training: **45** trainees
- Beekeeping Training: **30** female trainees.
- Motorcycle Maintenance Training: **30** male trainees.
- Mobile Phone Repair Training: **15** male trainees.
- Agricultural Field Schools: **50** trainees (male and female).










The project successfully created a safe and inclusive educational environment that encouraged students to continue their education and supported local communities through the following interventions:

- Construction of 14 new classrooms.
- Rehabilitation of 19 classrooms to provide comfortable learning spaces.
- Construction 10 and renovating 11 bathrooms to
 - ensure a healthy environment for students.
- Distribution of 600 school bags.
- Installation of 4 water tanks to meet clean water needs.
- Installation of 4 integrated solar systems and school radios to improve school resources and enhance the educational experience.

During the project period, and thanks to the support provided by the Yemen Humanitarian Fund and the effective partnership with Vision Hope International, life-saving nutrition and health services were provided to **11,837** individuals. These services included:

- Improving Community-based Management of Acute Malnutrition (CMAM): This targeted children aged 6 to 59 months, considering the needs of both boys and girls.
- Enhancing Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) Practices: This aimed at caregivers of children aged 0 to 23 months to ensure healthy nutrition.




